

# Ocellated Turkey Hunt Campeche, Mexico



PURSUIT

**Days of hunt: 4**

## **INCLUDES:**

- 1 Ocellated Turkey Permit
- Ground Transportation from Campeche or Merida Airport to the hunting area and back
- 8 outings total (morning and evening hunts)
- Meals, Soft drinks, Water, Snacks, Alcoholic Drinks (with moderation)
- Lodging with A/C, TV, Pool, and Wi-Fi at the lodge or Hotel Lobby
- 1 Local Guide per Hunter, Hunting vehicle
- Use of Shotgun and Shells /Full choked pump action and semi-auto 12 and .20 gauge
- Local Chef with Gourmet Local Dishes
- Assistance with the importation of trophies.

## NOT INCLUDED:

- Extra Trophies
- CITES – Export permit \$500 USD
- Export-Import Paperwork Fees \$550 USD(License, CITES, PROFEPA, USFW3177, Trophy Inspection)
- Cleaning, and Skinning of your Bird \$30 USD
- Cleaning, Skinning and Salting for Brockett Deer \$150
- Tips for Hunting Guides and Camp Staff
- EXTRA Alcohol (Bourbon, Whisky, Tequila, Vodka)
- Airline Tickets
- Hotels, Transportation, Food, and Lodging before and after the hunting
- Extra trip from Merida to the lodge or lodge to Merida \$250 USD (Depart Early after the hunt)
- Personal Expenses
- Laundry Services are available on the last day of each hunt (around \$10-\$20 USD per person)
- IF time permits, the Mayan Ruins are nearby for a day trip. \$25 per person.

## EXTRA TROPHY CHARGES:

- Extra Trophy \$1,500 USD Ocellated Turkey (each) Tag included
- Extra Trophy \$2,500 USD Brockett Deer (each) Tag included
- Extra Trophy \$500 USD coatimundi (Raccoon like animal) Tag included
- Extra Trophy \$250 USD Chachalaca Tag Included
- Extra trophy \$400 USD Javalina (Collared Pecari) tag included
- NON-Hunter \$300 USD per day

## ADDITIONAL DETAILS:

- 12-gauge or 20-gauge shotgun with XR Longbeard or TSS (provided) or bow (not provided) are recommended for the hunt. Shotguns are O/U, semi-auto, or pumps
- Groups are a maximum of 6 hunters.
- **Any animal shot and wounded is considered a taken trophy**
- Beginning in 2016 the United States Department of Agriculture requires a 3-177 permit to import bird products into the United States. **This permit and the CITES are NOT included with the tag and export paperwork.**
- The hunter is responsible for finding an USDA licensed taxidermist in their area, who will finalize the importation process. This process is completed when the hunter is at their home state. This information will be placed on the import paperwork in Mexico. After arriving back to the USA, each hunter has 2 weeks to contact their USDA licensed taxidermist for final paperwork processing

## OUR RECOMENDATIONS:

- Camo cothing, Cotton Pants, Cotton T-shirts, Cotton Long sleeve shirt to wear over t-shirt,
- Short pants and swim trunks
- Camo gloves, Cap or Hat, Net for the face,
- Paliacate for the neck or Towel band for the head because the humidity
- Bug-Insect repellent or Thermocell
- Small flash light
- Sunscreen
- Pocket knife
- Tennis shoes and good hiking/hunting boots
- Towel & Sandals for the shower
- Personal items (Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, etc)
- Camera & video camera
- Personal medicine

## TERMS & PAYMENT METHODS:

- All the prices are in USD
- To reserve your hunt, we require a deposit of 50% of the total cost for booking. The remaining 50% is required 30 days before the hunt. You can move your hunt for the next hunting season (if the client has an emergency)
- All deposits are non-refundable, you can pass your deposit to another hunter. The **HUNTER** is responsible for finding their replacement.
- The company is not responsible for abrupt climate changes, which could cause partial or total suspension of the hunt
- Our success rate has been 90 % since 2016 – 100 % Opportunity
- We strongly recommend you purchase travel insurance that covers trip cancellation policies
- **Wounded animals are considered harvested and require payment in full.**

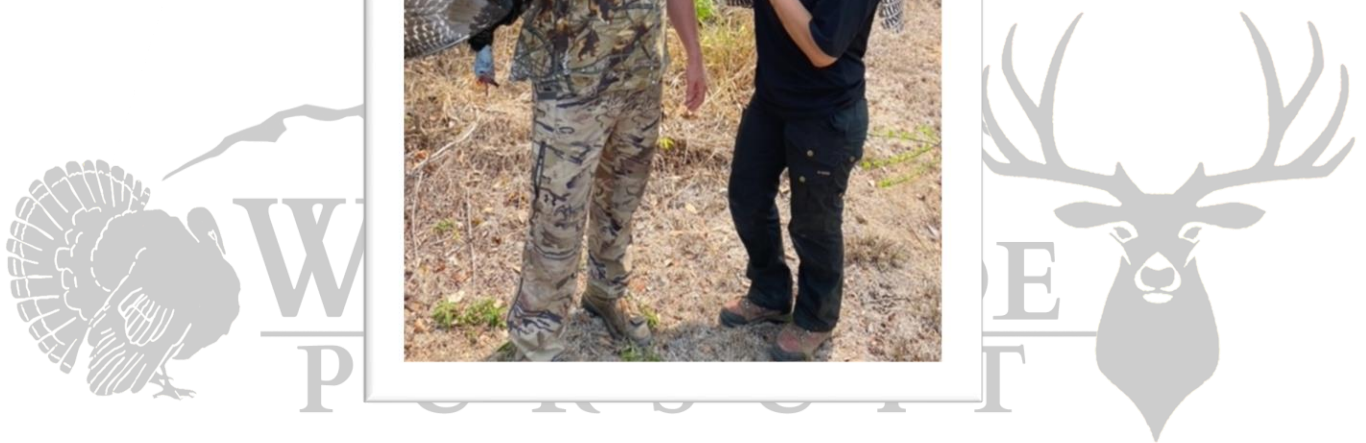
